It's cool2talk in D&G!



Cool2talk was launched in Dumfries & Galloway at Youth Beatz on Saturday 12th August 2017. This online service provides confidential and anonymous support for young people age 12+ on health and wellbeing issues. Originally developed in Tayside in 2004, Cool2talk is now available in 4 areas of Scotland, including D&G. A partnership between DG Health & Wellbeing, the NHS's School Nursing, CAMHS and Sexual Health services, and D&G Council's Youth Work service has enabled a two year pilot of this **digital intervention** locally. Laura Gibson, Health and Wellbeing Specialist and Manager of Cool2talk in D&G said "Bringing cool2talk to D&G provides an additional opportunity for your people to seek the help and support they need to maximise their health and wellbeing. Young people are digital natives, socialising, learning and seeking advice online. That's why it is essential to provide online services for people's health and wellbeing. This partnership approach in D&G should help embed digital approaches in to existing services for young people and ensure sustainability for future delivery". 

Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (**PrEP**) is medication which is now available for HIV negative men who have sex with men (MSM), who are at high risk of becoming infected with HIV.

New vaccine to project against

Men who have sex with men (MSM), aged up to and including 45 years of age who attend sexual health / HIV clinics will be eligible to receive the HPV vaccine as part of a national HPV vaccination programme.


HPV is the most common sexually transmitted infection in the UK. People are often infected with HPV without knowing as there are often no symptoms. Genital HPV infections are highly contagious and usually associated with sexual contact.

The HPV vaccine will help to prevent infection which can cause genital warts and HPV-associated cancers. It is especially important for those who have multiple sexual partners.


It starts with me

HIV Prevention England's It Starts With Me summer campaign (May to August) will relate to condom use, risk reduction and HIV testing. It aims to cut new infections of HIV through condom promotion and the reduction of undiagnosed HIV infection through increased testing. More testing means more people are aware of their status, making them better placed to prevent HIV being passed on. As a positive diagnosis leads to viral load reducing treatment, increased testing will also reduce infectiousness on the individual and community level.

The campaign also **promotes condom use** to ensure that any reduction in infections that result from increased testing and treatment are not wiped out by a rise in unprotected sex. 'Test. Treat. Protect. Take Action' runs across the campaign as a call to action. It Starts With Me stresses **the role of the individual responsibility** we all have in stopping the spread of HIV.

STI becoming untreatable



Gonorrhoea, is a sexually transmitted infection that effects an estimated 78 million people each year according to WHO.

Antibiotic resistance is causing gonorrhoea to become harder and sometimes impossible to treat, according to the World Health Organization (WHO).

Data from **77 countries** shows the infection has **developed resistance to some antibiotics**, and an increasing number of countries are finding that the infection can **become untreatable** by all known antibiotics, according to WHO.

Gonorrhoea can be transmitted through oral, anal and vaginal sex, and can be passed onto a baby during vaginal delivery. The infection can cause pelvic inflammatory disease and infertility if it goes untreated.

Old meningitis B vaccine 'may also protect against gonorrhoea'

The news comes from the results of a study in New Zealand that found people who'd been given an old version of the **Meningitis B vaccine** were **less likely to** be diagnosed with gonorrhoea.

But no protective effect was found for <u>chlamydia</u>, which is often diagnosed at the same time as gonorrhoea.

The publication of the study is timely – just last week the World Health Organization <u>issued a warning</u> about the rise in antibiotic-resistant strains of gonorrhoea.

The researchers claim this is the first vaccine to show any protective effect against gonorrhoea, but the vaccine in question is no longer in use.

The study was carried out by researchers from Sexual Health Services, Waikato District Health Board, and the University of Auckland in New Zealand, and Cincinnati Children's Hospital in the US.

The research was funded by GSK Vaccines, a pharmaceutical company, and Auckland UniServices, a branch of the university that partners academics with industry. No conflicts of interest were declared.

The study was published in the <u>peer-reviewed</u> journal The Lancet

Sexual Health Week 2017 11–17 September Let's talk about porn

The theme of fpa's annual Sexual Health Week **talking about pornography** – and there's a lot to talk about!

For staff in partner agencies you could help by spreading the word about how the sex in most pornography doesn't reflect reality, nor show how to protect yourself from sexually transmitted infections (STIs) or unwanted pregnancy.

FPA will **provide resources** for the week that will **help you talk about safer sex**. For example, most pornography doesn't show people using condoms or dams – which can contribute to a false impression that they aren't needed, or will hinder sexual pleasure. In the study we carried out locally for Sexual Health Week last year, more than **half of people didn't think it was true that you can get an STI from oral sex**. Find out more here

Stay safe, don't send | advice for young people | Gypsy, Roma and Traveller CSE Material

The Children's Society have recently completed a yearlong project to improve awareness of CSE amongst Gypsy, Roma and Traveller (GRT) communities and professionals likely to be working with the GRT community.

Stay Safe; Don't Send is an animated film telling the story of Mary Anne who gets into difficulties when sharing a photo online. This video was made by Gypsy and Traveller young people to raise awareness amongst their peers about how to stay safe online. <u>Watch the clip here:</u>

The film has an accompanying <u>activity book</u> for young people and <u>guide for</u> practitioners.

Translated leaflets and posters outline the warning signs of child sexual exploitation, and where young people, parents and carers can find help and information. These can be downloaded and used by members of the community or professionals to display or distribute as appropriate. English language versions are also available.

On measuring the number of vulnerable children in England

JULY 2017

The Children's Commissioner for England, Anne Longfield, has published a **new** analysis that reveals, for the first time, the scale of vulnerability among children in **England.** 'The Children's Commissioner's Report on measuring the number of vulnerable children' brings together a range of information held by various government departments, agencies and others. Its initial analysis reveals a host of shocking statistics about the number of children living in vulnerable situations.

- Almost 700,000 children are living in families that have vulnerabilities, including over 15,000 children living with an adult receiving alcohol treatment and nearly 12,000 living with an adult in drug treatment.
- **580,000 children** equivalent to the population of Manchester – are so vulnerable that the state has to step in and provide direct care, intervention or support.
- **370.000 children** whose actions have put their futures at risk, including 160,000 children temporarily or permanently excluded from school in

- 800,000 children aged 5 to 17 suffer mental health disorders.
- **200,000** children are judged by their local authority to have experienced trauma or abuse.

An estimated 46,000 children are thought to be part of a gang.

- 119,000 children are homeless or living in insecure or unstable housing.
- 170.000 children are estimated to do unpaid caring for family members, of which many have not been identified and offered support.
- 1,200 children are newly identified victims of modern slavery per year.


What do we offer?

- All methods of contraception are discussed and supplied free of charge
- Condoms, dams and lube
- Emergency contraception
- Pregnancy testing and termination referral
- Prophylaxis for HIV and Hepatitis B following high risk sexual exposure including sexual assault
- Hepatitis B immunisation
- Psychosexual counselling
- STI (sexually transmitted infection) testing and treatment—do not pass urine 1 hour before testing
