'LETS TALK ABOUT SEX 101 ways to show someone you love them without having sex' DUMFRIES & GALLOWAY'S SEXUAL HEALTH WEEK 25th - 31st January 2010

This was Dumfries & Galloway's 3rd annual sexual health week building on the theme 'Let's Talk About sex.' 1 partner summed this up nicely:

'it's always a good idea to pick consistent messages and re-enforce over the years so populations learn the key messages'

Packs containing a briefing paper, explaining the rationale behind the week, posters and a list of resources available from the department were distributed to 128 partner agencies. This was to afford our partners to use the packs in a suitable way for their clients. Some of the ways packs have been utilised:

- Detached youth work in Newton Stewart
- Part of a sexual health project carried out with young people at YES
- Events at Dumfries and Stranraer College which has led to further sexual health sessions at both Colleges
- Discussion sessions at youth centre's
- Built into training
- ❖ 101 ways poster was circulated nationally by Jo Adams- 'Delay' sexual health trainer from Sheffield Centre for HIV & Sexual Health

The new condom wallets were distributed to all partner agencies and young people encouraged to complete the online questionnaire on c4urself website. There have been over 700 responses so far. 1 comment received re wallet -

'Sexual Health and Risky Business'

Research conducted between October 09 - January 10 at the Youth Enquiry Service, Dumfries aimed to discover the current issues and concerns relating to local young people and their sexual health. Qualitative and quantitative data was obtained from an online survey, informal discussions and focus groups. Some of the findings from survey included:

- 26% young people agreed or strongly agreed that having sex without a condom once in a while is not a big deal, and an alarming number of young people disclosed that they were adverse to using condoms for various reasons such as 'Stopping to put on a condom would break the flow', and 'If you love and trust your partner you don't need to use one'.
- 65% answered yes when asked if they had ever had sex without a condom
- embarrassment talking about sex was identified as a barrier to accessing contraceptives. 37% agreed or strongly agreed that It's hard to bring up the topic of condoms with a partner and 28% agreed or strongly agreed that Getting condoms is embarrassing.
- One quarter of the young people who completed the survey had been drinking the first time they had sex and many expressed regret in relation to the experience.

- 50% disclosed that alcohol or drugs had at some stage influenced their decision to do something sexual.
- 43% had at some stage done more sexually than they had planned because of drinking or using drugs.
- 79% either agreed or strongly agreed with the statement that People my age often don't use condoms when they are drinking or using drugs, yet only 23% agreed or strongly agreed that It's not a big deal if people my age make decisions about sex when they are drinking or using drugs.
- 67% agreed or strongly agreed that If you've been seeing someone for a while it's expected that you'll have sex
- 48% agreed or strongly agreed that Once you've had sex it's harder to say no the next time
- 48% agreed or strongly agreed that Being seen as sexually active helps you fit in with peers

Although often aware of the risks associated with unsafe sexual practices, it appears that local young people don't often consider themselves personally at risk.

Alcohol is commonly seen as a factor in not using a condom with a new partner, regretting sexual activity and having sex with someone who a person would not normally find attractive.


Young people in the area often face a double challenge as they evidently experience pressure to drink alcohol as well as pressure to be sexually active.




